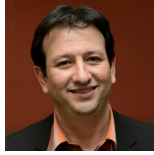

Dear participants,

Welcome to the 4<sup>th</sup> edition of the International Workshops on Public Policy. Launched in Pittsburgh in 2018 to complement the offerings of the biennial General Conference, the IWPP has become a key event for scholars who wish to discuss specific policy research questions in depth, with the project of building a network, but also preparing a special issue or edited book. Following the successes of Pittsburgh 2018 and Budapest 2022, IWPP Guadalajara is on its way to becoming a great success as well.

As the first conference organized in Latin America, IWPP4 will bring together 300 participants from 35 countries in 23 different workshops. IWPP is a very diverse and multifaceted conference and we are pleased to welcome PhD students, who represent a third of our participants. This conference is hybrid, with 16% of participants attending online, allowing those who cannot attend in person to participate.

IPPA now has a significant grant policy to support participants who are unable to pay for the participation costs. We have offered 93 IPPA fee grants to participants without university support, allowing them to attend without paying any fees. Additionally, we have provided 68 IPPA Accommodation Grants to support PhD students and facilitate their attendance at our event.

First of all, we would like to thank the University of Guadalajara and especially Enrique Cabrero Mendoza, Oliver Meza Canales, and Diego Escobar Gonzalez, who have contributed to making this event a great success. The involvement of our local host is always a key dimension to ensure the success of any IPPA event, and their support throughout our preparations has been crucial.

A brief note about IPPA. In 2024, IPPA will celebrate its tenth anniversary and continues to grow. We are preparing for our next ICPP in Chiang Mai in 2025, which is now the largest international public policy event. Our Open Access Journal is now in its fifth year and has been integrated into the Scopus ranking. We now have 6 Seasonal Schools each year for PhD students and early career researchers around the world.

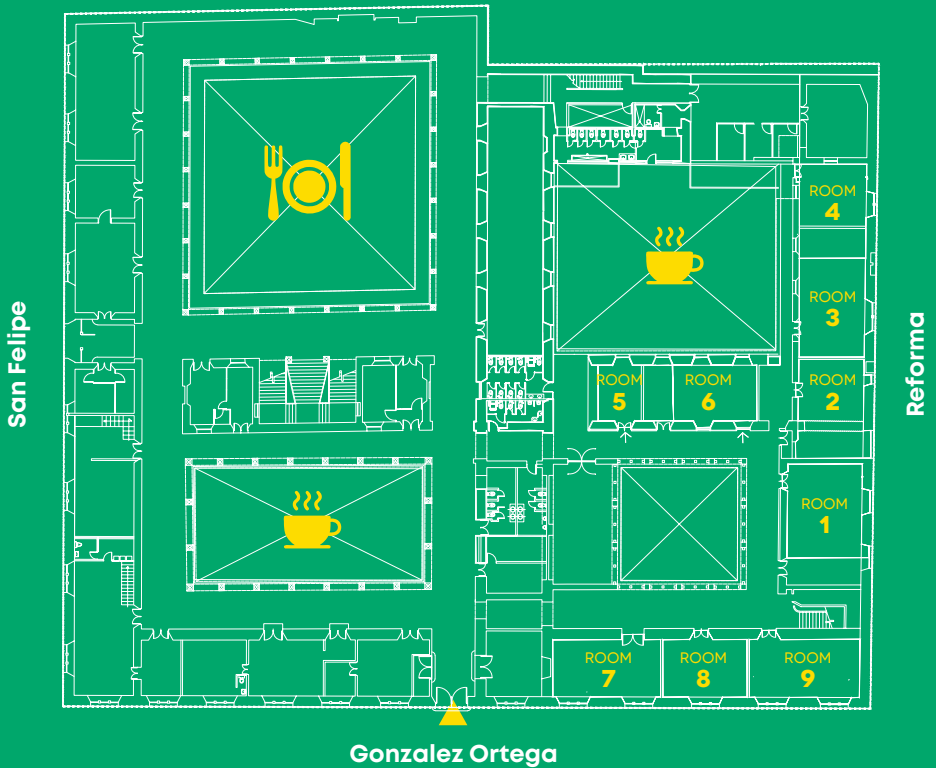

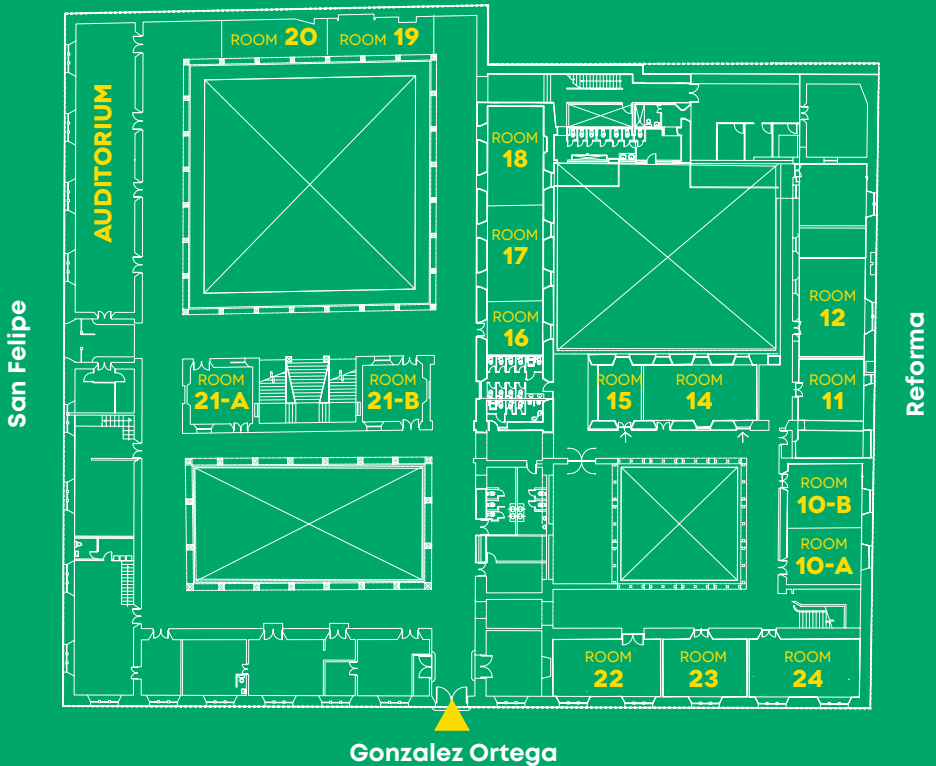
